Task Force Is Studying Adding Grades

Heartland Lutheran High School has formed a task force to study the possibility of adding grades to the school. The task force has formulated surveys and interview questions to use as part of the investigation. The surveys will be distributed to a number of groups in September, including association congregations.

For many years, people have talked about whether or not HLHS should include a middle school. Much of this conversation is based on the fact that both Grand Island Central Catholic and Lincoln Lutheran begin at 6th grade. Many people have wondered if adding middle school or even elementary school grades would benefit the operation and sustenance of HLHS.

In addition to sending out and collecting surveys, the task force plans to interview more than 30 key people. Those to be interviewed include Lutheran elementary school principals, pastors, church leaders, and community leaders. The task force hopes to have compiled the surveys and completed the interviews by the end of October, at which point they will present the information to the Board of Directors.

Two Town Hall Meetings have been scheduled to give church and community members and opportunity to voice their opinions as part of this investigation. Anyone who desires to should join us on Monday, Oct. 12 or Tuesday, Oct. 13 for these town hall meetings.


The task force will not make any recommendations. The Board will have the responsibility of deciding how to use the information. The feedback from this process will tell us to drop the idea of adding grades, encourage us to pursue it as part of our long-term strategic plan, or reveal that the idea needs further study.

This is only a study. No decisions have been made. The leadership of HLHS wants to make sure that this would be benefit HLHS without hurting in any way the association congregations or area Lutheran elementary/middle schools.
